NOTES:

- SPAN103, 203, 204, and 207 must be taken in the appropriate order, once a student has taken a higher level course they will not be allowed to return to a lower level language course.
- Students are not permitted to take SPAN301 and SPAN303 simultaneously without explicit permission from the Undergraduate Advisor.
- Native Spanish speakers and all others with the ability to begin coursework at a higher level should speak with the Undergraduate Advisor for placement and course substitutions.
- All Spanish students are required to take the Foreign Language Placement Assessment (FLPA) to ensure that they are placed into the best course for them. For information about the FLPA:
